PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



"The greatest danger in times of turbulence is not the turbulence; it is to act with yesterday's logic."

- Peter Drucker.

The academic year 2021-22 was yet another challenging year for all of us. This global health crisis brought us not only enormous hurdles in imparting education on the school campus but also opportunities to make available the best possible education through digital media. This possibility gave us space to allow classrooms to enter your homes or apartments.

Uncertainty all around paved the way for a massive digital change in the education sector in an unprecedented way. We were confronted with four stages of challenges namely, Volatile, Uncertain, Complex, and Ambiguous world (VUCA) which made us re-formulate our teaching and learning experience. This threat of VUCA was successfully overcome with equally strong and innovative ways.

St Joseph's School had a different approach in this endeavour of confronting the VUCA that is, we moved from volatility to vision, from uncertainty to understanding, from complexity to clarity, and from ambiguity to agility or adaptability. Thus we evolved ourselves into making our blended teaching successful and effective.

However, I learnt a lot despite our different experiments with online and blended teaching and learning modes. I feel that there is nothing that can replace classroom teaching. It is the best way of teaching young minds. We notice the learning gap has widened. Today, the teachers have the herculean task of bridging this gap. Schools are more than a place of learning, moreover, they are a miniature of a good society. The lively interactions with friends and teachers, practical learning of subjects, which the regular school offers along with a host of academic and life skills to students are not possible in online mode.

Learning to relate with each other, participating in co-curricular activities, playing games, and celebrating festivals with others in the school are among the many activities that enrich a student's personality. While online classes impart theoretical knowledge, the social aspects that the school enables to build, like, valuable life skills such as communication, empathy, teamwork, leadership, negotiation, and as such many more aspects could be learnt only by being present in the school and its premises.

Several problems, the students of this pandemic era are facing, mainly, relational, emotional, social as well as physical well-being due to lack of games and other external activities. Having realized quickly this aspect, we brought in our online classes virtual fun activities for the children. I am sure most of you, dear parents, have enjoyed them as well. We too had online sessions on stress management and burnout issues. I appreciate all the parents who supported and actively participated in this venture. Another aspect of our blended learning was collaboration. Parents, teachers, and students learnt to collaborate as well as take responsibility for each other.

Data mining is another aspect that this blended method of learning gave to the students, parents, and teachers. Students can access any amount of data from the internet and other platforms which was not possible in classroom teaching.

As a whole when we look back at the academic year we have many positive and negative elements attached to this unexpected phenomenon of global health issues. We must focus on positive aspects and carry forward in making our life and our learning comfortable, effective, and successful.

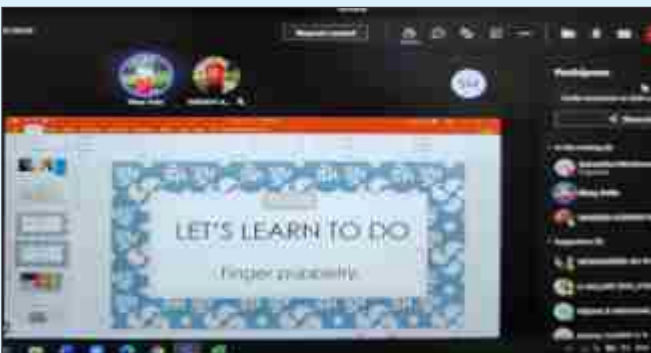
PEACE AND RECONCILIATION DAY
